

Claysville Business Association

June 15, 2010

The Claysville Business Association meeting was called to order at 8 A.M.

Minutes were provided in hard copy. Minutes were read and approved. Minutes were not posted on the website due to some technical difficulties.

No treasurer's report was given.

CAPRI – A report on the success of the Pike Days event was given – it appeared that the event generated \$800 dollars beyond expenses.

Penny Seaman reported that the Claysville Yard Sale event has ran its course as there was very little participation this year. We should wait a few years and try it again.

No CAPRI meeting will be held until the second Monday of September

The CAPRI team will resubmit the application for gaming revenue.

The CBA website is back up and operating.

Park report – Playground equipment has arrived and installation is planned on June 17. The borough will be responsible for the equipment maintenance. We received \$40,000 to purchase the equipment. \$15,000 came from DCED and \$25,000 from gaming proceeds.

Redevelopment Authority – There will a meeting regarding the review of the architect plans for the administration building. The meeting will be held at 10 am.

Sewage/water rate increase – The borough can request a hearing – people who signed the petition should be at the meeting. Approximately 700 residents are affected.

The American Legion voted to change its name from the Hunt Post ---- to the Hunt-Kennedy Post ----.

A Comprehensive Plan Meeting will be held on June 30 upstairs in the Legion at 6 PM. Tyler Lincoln is the representative.

2 Townhouses have been sold and the redevelopment authority reports they may be ready to build some patio homes.

Dutch Fork Lake Report – June 14 was the 51st anniversary of the Lake. The BCWS Association has been approved to participate in the voluntary water monitoring programs. Volunteers will be trained on the use of the meters and identification of fish species. The McGuffy enviro-thon team came in second in the competition.

McGuffy District – Beverly Arbor will be appointed as the new superintendent beginning July 1.

There has been a tentative agreement with the teacher's association. It has been approved the teachers and awaits approval by the school board on June 16.

A Tentative agreement has been reached with the custodial and food preparation personnel.

J. DeSchamp won the 300 meter hurdles in the State Track Meet.

The district hopes to have a completed budget by fall.

9 students enlisted in the military – 1 in ROTC.

The 50th McGuffy High School graduation will be held on June 15. Baccalaureate will be held on June 14.

It is estimated that a high percentage of students went on to higher education.

Recognition was given to Joe Stefka and Larry Sprowls for their participation on and support of the CBA.

Relay for Life - \$34,000 was raised by the walk. It was well attended and will be repeated next year.

Jody White was commended for her good organizational planning and implementation.

It was reported that the Legion had made plans to begin work on a memorial wall and will be developing a funding plan.

Comments –

A question was asked about what was being done about the vacant building and their appearance. It was suggested that the borough should be approached about enforcing cleanup of business/building re fronts and sidewalks.

It was reported that there were possible new businesses coming to Claysville and that some businesses were not doing well in the current financial environment. The newest business is the Crossfire Auto Repair.

A question was asked about whether or not the old brochures were still at the truck stop. They are, but need to be updated with new businesses and information. A plan will be made to update the brochures.

We need to consider reimbursement of Jim for working on the website.

Meeting was adjourned at 9 AM. Next meeting will be the third Tuesday of July at 8 AM.
